Interview Skills:

- Q1: Tell us about a time you had a conflict...
- Q2: Describe your experience working on collaborative efforts
- Q3: What is your approach to supporting various constituents
- Q4: ...often embedded in a scenario type question

Reference Checks

- Q1: How does the candidate handle difficult people
- Q2: What is their conflict resolution protocol
- Q3: Does the candidate deal with others in a tactful manner
- Q4: Describe the candidate's political acumen and ability to work with leadership
